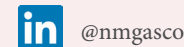

THE COST OF GAS

As a regulated utility, New Mexico Gas Company does not make a profit on the natural gas we purchase on behalf of our customers but passes the cost of natural gas from suppliers directly on to you. October's cost of gas is \$0.3023. The November cost of gas can be found as a line item on your bill beginning November 1st. Last November's cost of gas was \$0.3042. The estimated average home gas use for November is 73 therms and the estimated average residential gas bill for November is \$51.

We do not make a profit on the natural gas we purchase on behalf of our customers.
